"The Inter-departmental Fire Investigation Task Force, led by the FSD, will carry out investigation in four aspects, namely whether any criminal elements have been involved, the circumstances leading to the death and injuries of fire personnel, the modes and operations of industrial buildings, and ways to enhance the operational procedures of the FSD," a spokesman for the FSD said.
