The Secretary for Security, Mr John Lee, reviewed the 179th Fire Services passing-out parade for 23 station officers, nine ambulance officers, 69 firemen and 69 ambulancemen today (August 24).

Speaking at the parade, Mr Lee said, "Fire and ambulance services are one of the indispensable features in maintaining the safety of Hong Kong, and such services are constantly faced with various risks and challenges. Mr Lee also noted that the FSD is actively developing the Fourth Generation Mobilising System, one of the most important tasks in the coming years, to replace the current Third Generation Mobilising System. The new system will enhance mobilising efficiency, so as to assist fire and ambulance personnel in protecting life and property. Through collecting and analysing operation data, the system will also help the department to improve its services.

Mr Lee also encouraged the graduates to work hard to better prepare themselves and uphold their mission to protect and save lives. "They should make use of the knowledge and technology learnt, as well as the team spirit built up in the Academy to safeguard our city, so that Hong Kong will continue to thrive as a place of prosperity and stability," he added.


The parade was followed by a demonstration of firefighting and rescue techniques


