False Claims about FSD-Approved/Authorized Fire Safety Talks & Revocation of Fire Safety Ambassador Membership

The Fire Services Department (FSD) has recently received a number of public enquiries or

complaints regarding the false claims made by "XX Fire Prevention Organizations" or "XX

Fire Danger Concern Groups" and "XX Fire Prevention Mutual-aid Organizations".

These Organizations/ Groups falsely claimed that they had obtained approval/authorization

from the FSD to hold fire safety talks, but they would eventually proceed to promote the

sale of fire-fighting equipment and products. As these acts might convey incorrect fire

safety knowledge, you are therefore reminded to be alert so as not to be misled.

In the course of our investigation, we found that a Fire Safety Ambassador Trainer engaged

in commercial activity by making use of his title. As his act has seriously contravened the

appointment requirements of a Fire Safety Ambassador/ Fire Safety Ambassador Trainer,

we have revoked his appointment and taken back his FSA Identity Card and Appointment

Certificate.

In fact, FSD places great emphasis on fire safety education and is ready to provide free fire

safety talks to community groups, organizations and schools, etc. Interested parties may

submit their applications to the Community Relations Section (CRS) of the FSD. The

application forms (FS/CR/3) are obtainable by fax, from CRS, or from the fire station

nearest to their place of residence, or from our homepage
