FSD Circular Letter No. 2/98 Recall of Omega Sprinklers

As a result of defects identified in the captioned sprinkler heads, there has been a general recall action on the 'Omega' series sprinklers manufactured by the Central Sprinkler Corporation and Central Sprinkler Company in USA. In response to such action, I now announce, with immediate effect, that the approvals on the sale and use of the 'Omega' series sprinklers (as per attached list) approved by FSD previously are now withdrawn. You are therefore advised to check all the sprinkler installations under your charge/maintenance for the possible use of the said "Omega" series sprinkler heads and to arrange for necessary replacement. I should also be grateful if you would let me have a list of buildings or premises that are installed with such sprinklers in order that we could follow the matter up with the owner/occupier concerned.

2. We understand that there are replacement programmes of the sprinklers arranged by the manufacturer in the United States of America, but you should liaise with the local agent for arrangements in Hong Kong. For more information on this issue, you should contact:-



Omega Sprinkler Update

For more than two years, UL has been actively urging homeowners and other property owners whose buildings are equipped with Omega brand sprinklers manufactured by Central Sprinkler Company since 1982 to have samples of those sprinklers submitted to UL or Central Sprinkler for operational testing. Of the more than 4,000 Omega sprinkler samples submitted to UL from more than 250 locations throughout the United States, 27 percent did not operate at 5 pounds per square inch (psi), which is the UL requirement for new sprinklers. UL has determined the problem to be site specific. On Oct. 8, 1998, new requirements for UL 199, the Standard for Automatic Sprinklers for Fire-Protection Service, went into effect, and the UL and Underwriters Laboratories of Canada (ULC) Listings for all Omega brand sprinklers manufactured by Central Sprinkler were withdrawn.

On Oct. 14, 1998, the <u>U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC)</u> and <u>Central Sprinkler Corp.</u> announced a nationwide recall of approximately 8.4 million Omega brand fire sprinklers manufactured since 1982. The CPSC alleges that Omega sprinklers are defective and could likely fail in a fire. For further information on the Omega sprinkler recall, please call Central Sprinkler at: (800) 896-5685.

Although the Omega sprinkler recall is primarily directed to properties located in the United States, UL understands that Central Sprinkler is planning a voluntary program for properties located outside the United States. CPSC, Central Sprinkler Recall Omega Fire Sprinklers; Settle Lawsuit

WASHINGTON, D.C. - The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and Central Sprinkler announced today the nationwide recall of approximately 8.4 million Omega brand fire sprinklers manufactured since 1982 by Central Sprinkler Corp. and its subsidiary, Central Sprinkler Co., of Lansdale, Pa. CPSC alleges that Omegas are defective and could likely fail in a fire. This recall announcement follows the <u>resolution of the lawsuit</u> filed by the Commission staff against these companies on March 3, 1998.

CPSC alleges that, on average, between 30 and 40 percent of Omegas removed from various locations across the country for testing failed to activate as they should. In some buildings, all Omegas tested failed to activate. CPSC is warning consumers that they are at risk of bodily injury or death and should have Omegas replaced as soon as possible. CPSC is urging consumers to take immediate action to determine whether the buildings where they live and work are equipped with Omegas, and if so, to call the Omega Sprinkler Recall Hotline to participate in the recall. Properly functioning fire sprinklers save lives when a fire occurs. With the Omega sprinklers, this line of defense may not be there when it is needed most.

CPSC has received reports of Omega sprinklers not functioning in 17 fires. At least four persons suffered injuries, including burns and smoke inhalation. Over \$4.3 million in property damage has been reported. The fires occurred between 1990 and the present in Arizona, California, Florida, Georgia, Indiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, New York, Pennsylvania and Texas. In some cases, the sprinkler directly above the fire failed to operate.

Omega fire sprinklers are installed in homes, schools, hospitals, dormitories, nursing homes, prisons, offices, hotels and other buildings as well as federal buildings, including the Smithsonian Museums and the U.S. Capitol, which house many of the country's historical artifacts. Omegas have been or are being removed from many state and federal buildings, including the White House. As part of the settlement agreement, Central has asked Underwriters Laboratories to withdraw its listing of approval for all Omega brand fire sprinklers.

Consumers themselves should be able to determine whether their homes or other buildings are equipped with Omega fire sprinklers. On most models, consumers will be able to see three flat round metal disks stacked one above the other with a small space between each disk. Consumers should not attempt to unscrew the sprinkler or shut down their sprinkler system to determine if they have Omegas. Central will send consumers a packet of information to help them identify the sprinklers

involved.

Central is offering consumers free replacement glass bulb fire sprinklers and reimbursement toward the cost of having Omega sprinklers removed and replaced. CPSC routinely requires companies to pay the full costs associated with recalls. In this case, Central's reported financial condition reveals that its ability to pay the cost of replacing the Omega sprinklers is limited. Consumers are urged to call the Omega Sprinkler Recall Hotline, available 24 hours a day, at (800) 896-5685 or to access the Omega recall website at omegarecall.com to participate in the recall. For consumers to get any monetary reimbursement for installation costs, they must submit a proof of claim and release to Central postmarked by August 1, 1999. Consumers are urged to take immediate action and call today.

Since Omegas may not operate in a fire, it is particularly important that consumers have at least one fully operational smoke detector on every floor of their home, especially near bedrooms. To ensure that the detector's batteries are working, test the detector every month. Consumers also should have a well-defined and rehearsed escape plan and an alternate escape plan in the event of a fire. 

This site contains important product safety information about Omega brand fire sprinklers that are being recalled by Central Sprinkler Company in conjunction with the <u>United States Consumer Product Safety Commission</u>. We urge you to read the following information carefully, especially if your home or office building contains fire sprinklers.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

RECALL OF CENTRAL SPRINKLER'S OMEGA BRAND FIRE SPRINKLERS

To Consumer/Homeowner:

The Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and Central Sprinkler recently announced the recall of all Omega fire sprinklers. According to CPSC, these sprinklers are defective and could likely fail in a fire, which could result in bodily injury or death.

Please read the entire attached packet of information carefully. It is very important for you to determine if Omega sprinklers are installed in your home or building. The notice contains product information regarding the recall with the CPSC, as well as the preliminary settlement Central has reached with several private class action lawsuits. Please refer to the product information sheets which explain how to identify Omega sprinklers. Because sprinklers can be difficult to identify, we urge you to check with your architect, builder, sprinkler contractor, plumber, homeowners' association or property manager.

This recall is available to all owners of Omega fire sprinklers. To participate in the recall you must complete the enclosed <u>Proof of Claim Form</u> and <u>Waiver and Release of Claims Form</u> as soon as possible and return them to Central Sprinkler at the address indicated in the Proof of Claim Form. Central Sprinkler will mail you a free replacement sprinkler for every Omega sprinkler owned.

In order to receive replacement sprinklers and to qualify for reimbursement toward installation costs, you must complete the Proof of Claim Form and the accompanying Waiver and Release of Claims Form and return them to Central Sprinkler, postmarked by August 1, 1999. Although it is important to provide complete information, please submit your Proof of Claim Form postmarked by August 1, 1999, even if you cannot provide complete responses to all the questions. In order to receive reimbursement toward installation costs, you must complete and return the Verification Form within 365 days after you receive your replacement sprinklers. Those owners filing a Proof of Claim and Waiver and Release of Claims Forms postmarked after August 1, 1999 but before November 1, 2001, still qualify to receive replacement sprinklers (though not reimbursement). The recall terms may also provide benefits to those who have already replaced Omegas between May 1, 1996 and the effective date of the Commission's Order.

Please read all of this information carefully, as it explains your legal rights and obligations. If you have any questions about how to complete the forms or how to identify an Omega Sprinkler, please call the Omega Sprinkler Recall Hotline at 1-800-927-5291.

Do not delay! Take action today. Until you receive your free replacement sprinklers, you should have a well-defined and rehearsed escape plan, an alternative plan and working smoke detectors on every floor of your home, especially near bedrooms.




