Entry Requirements:

The candidates should -

- (i) be permanent residents of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region;
- (ii) be full-time students studying in accredited degree programmes with major in Marketing, Communication, Information Management, Public Administration, Public Relations, Social Sciences, or related disciplines offered by local/non-local post-secondary institutions;
- (iii) have completed the first year of study and not be students graduating in 2021;
- (iv) be proficient in both written Chinese and English; and
- (v) be proficient in using Microsoft Office applications.

Note: Proficient in graphic and video editing will be an advantage.

Duties:

- (i) To conduct research and evaluation on matters in relation to Fire Service Installation and Equipment;
- (ii) To draw up and implement publicity plans in relation to Fire Service Installation and Equipment, including preparing blogs, brief, speeches and other publicity materials;
- (iii) To compile statistical reports, perform statistical analysis and maintain database in relation to Fire Service Installation and Equipment; and
- (iv) To perform any other duties as assigned by senior officers.

Terms of Appointment:

Successful candidates will be appointed on non-civil service contract terms. Interns are normally required to work 44 hours per week, inclusive of meal breaks. Except otherwise provided, rest days, statutory holidays, paid leave, sickness days and sickness allowance, where appropriate, are generally

in line with those provided for under the Employment Ordinance (Cap. 57). They are subject to Mandatory Provident Fund Scheme Ordinance (Cap. 485).

Salary:

\$10,500 per month
